



 TPQ=Threshold Planning Quantity

Exemptions:

- *FDA regulated products
- *Articles
- *Household packaged products
- *Substances used in R & D labs, hospitals or other medical facilities
- *Substances used in routine agricultural operations
- *Fertilizers held for sale by retailer
- *Retail service stations (Gas 75,000 gallons, Diesel 100,000 gallons)

What is the Tier II Report?

- A report required under SARA Title III Section 312 documenting hazardous substances stored at a facility above thresholds,
- Submitted annually to state and local officials, and
- Made available to the public upon request

Why is it so important to report your facilities hazardous chemical storage?

- When reporting you are sharing your chemical storage information with the Local Fire Department, Local Emergency Planning Committee, first responders and the Indiana Emergency Response Commission.
- Knowing what chemicals are stored at your facility may be a matter of life and death.
- The law requires those storing hazardous chemicals above regulatory thresholds to report.
- Failure to report may result in fines and penalties.

Where do you start – Ask yourself the following questions regarding your facility's chemical storage

- Do you need to submit a Tier II report?
- Are you storing 10,000 pounds of a material that requires a Safety Data Sheet (SDS)?
- Have you converted all of your chemical volumes and weights into pounds to determine if you are above reporting thresholds?
- Are you storing an Extremely Hazardous Substance – See your SDS's and EPA's List of List?
- Do you have large equipment like forklifts or high-lows that require large sulfuric acid batteries?
- Has your facility reported in the past?

Frequently reported chemicals

Type of Substance	Chemical
Extremely Hazardous	Sulfuric Acid
Hazardous	Diesel Fuel No. 2
Hazardous	Gasoline
Hazardous	Propane
Hazardous	Lead
Extremely Hazardous	Anhydrous Ammonia
Hazardous	Diesel
Extremely Hazardous	Battery Acid
Extremely Hazardous	Lead Acid Battery
Extremely Hazardous	Battery Electrolytes

Helpful product estimate conversions



20 (55) gallon drums = approx 10,000 lbs.

275 Gallon Caged IBC Tote (Houston)

5 totes = approx 10,000 lbs.



Multiple cylinders = Is a good indication/may need to report



4ft high pallet of bags = approx 2000 lbs
5 pallets = approx 10,000 lbs.
