FAQ - FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Do I call the Coroner's Office if a friend or loved one passes away and I'm present?

A: No. Always call 911 to report a death. Law Enforcement will respond and notify the Coroner.

Q: How do I contact the Hamilton County Coroner's Office?

A: The Hamilton County Coroner's Office can be reached at 317-770-4415. The office is open Monday-Friday 8:00am – 5:00pm and is closed on holidays. Investigators are available 24/7.

To contact the after-hours on-call Investigator, please call the Hamilton County Communications Center 317-773-1282.

Q: Why is the Coroner's Office investigating my loved one's death?

A: The Hamilton County Coroner's Office is governed by Indiana law. These laws require that the Coroner investigate certain types of deaths and determine the cause and manner of the death. If the Coroner's Office is involved in investigating the death of your loved one, it is likely that the circumstances of your loved one's death require investigation under Indiana statutes. Deaths requiring investigation generally include:

1. Deaths associated with trauma or violence, whether homicide, suicide or accident.
2. Deaths associated with suspicious or unusual or unnatural circumstances.
3. Deaths not attended by a physician and where the cause of death cannot be certified by a physician.
4. Decedents who are unclaimed, exposed or unidentified.
5. Deaths due to infections or contagious disease or other potentially hazardous public health conditions.
6. Deaths of children under age 18 who do not have a significant diagnosed condition that led to death.
7. Deaths involving incarcerated people or those in police custody.
