

Frequently Asked Questions:

Where is your clinic?

The Hamilton County Health Department is located at 18030 Foundation Drive in Noblesville. It is off of ST Rd 37 & 32/38, past Applebee's and Home Depot.

What are the clinic hours?

Clinic hours are Tuesday and Thursday 8:30 AM -2:30 PM. You must be pre-registered or be an established patient to come to a clinic. This is a walk-in clinic, no appointment is necessary. Our office is closed for all government holidays. *****During high volume periods of the year, we reserve the right to limit the number of patients seen at each clinic*****

Who is eligible to come to the clinic?

Beginning January 1, 2012, only children 0 thru 18 years of age who are on Medicaid, are Alaskan Native/American Indian, have no health insurance or health insurance that does not pay for vaccines can be seen. Those who have insurance that pays for vaccines, including those who have high deductibles, 80/20 or percentage based coverage or has a co-pay, are not eligible. Check with your insurance provider if unsure of coverage.

Is there a cost for the shots?

There is an \$8.00 administrative fee per vaccine. We accept cash and credit/debit cards. A small transaction fee is charged for credit/debit payments. Medicaid recipients MUST bring their card for each visit to verify eligibility and waive the fee.

Who can bring my child for shots?

A parent or legal representative must accompany your child to each visit.

What should I bring to clinic?

If you have one, bring your child's immunization record to be updated. If you have not provided legal guardianship or adoption papers, they should be brought with you.

How many shots will my child receive?

We review each child's record individually and give the vaccines that are recommended by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) for your child's age. We administer all the vaccines your child needs at each visit.

How can I obtain a copy of my child's shot record?

An updated immunization record is given to all children who receive vaccines at our office the day of their visit. If you have misplaced the record, you will need to sign an immunization release form that is on our website and fax or bring it to our office. Immunization records cannot be emailed. We also put your child's immunization record into the Children and Hoosier Immunization Registry (CHIRP) so your physician or school nurse can review them. Ask your physician if they participate in CHIRP.

Do you give immunizations to adults?

Not at the present time. We do offer seasonal flu vaccine for those 19 years and older. Check our website for dates and times in October.

Are you a travel clinic?

We are not a travel clinic. We provide information about travel vaccines and where they are given. That information is listed on our website. We do not provide immunizations for travel.

Do you provide lice shampoo?

No. We do not provide lice shampoo.

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
