FESTIVAL AND APPLICATION RULES AND GUIDELINES:

- **Reservation:** Applicant may reserve more than one spot. Each spot costs \$30.00. Spots will be placed together where applicable. Late requests will be harder to accommodate.
 - Requested locations and spaces are *never* guaranteed and can be changed at any point leading up to the festival date. Requests for placement near another specific vendor will be considered but no guarantees of placement can be made. All efforts will be made to contact applicant of this change. Typically, final locations are not determined or made public until a week or two before the festival date.
- **Location Descriptions and Rules:** Spots will vary in size. Generally we allow all applicants a 10x10 space. If you have a canopy with legs that extend beyond 10 feet – your canopy will not fit and you may be asked to take down the structure. If a spot becomes too narrow for you to set-up, you will be moved on-site to an accommodating location – typically only one or two overflow spots exist.
 - **Covered Bridge** – located on the historic Potter's Covered Bridge. No canopies, generators, open flames, and side displays over 5 feet tall are allowed. No electricity available at this location. This location has uneven surfaces.



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- **Wooded Area** – located mostly in areas with trees. Ground is either grass or dirt. Some pavement spots are available in this area. Trees may restrict canopy usage – but this is typically not a problem. This location is directly accessible via sidewalks. Electricity is available but is typically reserved only for food and entertainment vendors and exhibitors.
- **Grass Area** – located on open grass with no trees. Usually reserved for special exhibitors requiring large space. Not accessible via sidewalks and includes uneven terrain. Only a handful of these spots are available. Electricity is available but is typically reserved only for food and entertainment vendors and exhibitors.
- **Paved Lot** – located on the parking surface. This is our largest area and can accommodate a vast variety of exhibitor types. Hard surface with some sidewalk accessibility. Electricity is available but is typically reserved only for food and entertainment vendors and exhibitors.
- **Electricity:** Applicants may request electricity; however, this is typically reserved only for food, entertainment, and recreation vendors and exhibitors. Generators are only allowed after approval from event coordinator and are typically reserved only for food, entertainment, and recreation vendors. Hamilton County Parks and Recreation Department is not responsible for maintenance of generators allowed on-site. Please provide all electrical cord needed if approved for electricity.
- **Canopies:** No tents or canopies are allowed on the historic covered bridge. This reduces sight lines for safety and enjoyment for festival attendees on the narrow bridge. Canopies may be used at all other locations. Please provide your own equipment to secure canopies to the ground. Canopies are not provided by Hamilton County Parks and Recreation Department.
- **Tables and Chairs:** Hamilton County Parks and Recreation Department does not provide exhibitors and vendors chairs or tables unless approved by the event coordinator. This request is typically reserved only for exhibitors and vendors that have been contracted by Hamilton County Parks and Recreation Department.
- **Inclement Weather:** Potter's Bridge Fall Festival is a rain or shine event and will not be rescheduled. All efforts will be made to not cancel the festival unless circumstances arise that would be harmful to guests, vendors, exhibitors, and staff. Vendors and exhibitors can expect to be contacted before the event if a cancellation occurs via email. It is impossible to notify all vendors and exhibitors via phone. If weather is appearing inclement on the day of the event – please call 317.674.2250 for event updates beginning at 8:00AM. No refunds will be given for cancellations due to inclement weather.
- **Photography:** Hamilton County Parks and Recreation Department may photograph and videotape any and all vendors / exhibitor staff, booths, products, and services and post to Hamilton County social media and websites. These photographs and videos may be used for promotional purposes by Hamilton County Parks and Recreation Department.
- **Payment:** Applicant fees must be rendered to Hamilton County Parks and Recreation Department and the application must be approved by a staff member in order to participate in this event. If fees are not paid by submission deadline then applicant forfeits their requested location. Payment via check or money order is preferred. Payment via credit or debit is acceptable – indicate that you will pay using this method. Cash payments are not acceptable.



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- **Vendor and Exhibitor Selection:**

- Vendors and exhibitors are selected based off of products and services rendered. Potter's Bridge Fall Festival is an arts and crafts festival; thus, priority is given to arts and crafts vendors and exhibitors. Duplication of styles, type, and creation of various arts and crafts goods will be allowed. However, this is monitored by the event coordinator and adjustments to this duplication allowance will be made as necessary. When possible vendors and exhibitors selling the same type of goods/services will be separated from each other as much as possible.
- **Arts and Crafts Vendors:** Arts and crafts vendors are defined as vendors and exhibitors selling goods that are primarily hand-made and/or at least 75% hand-made, constructed at home (or workshop), and are not generally available locally at brick & mortar shops. Online sales of hand-made goods is allowed under this definition.
- **Commercial Vendors:** Commercial vendors and exhibitors will be allowed but only a very small number will be admitted. Commercial vendors and exhibitors are defined as vendors and exhibitors whose products are less than 75% hand-made and/or whose products are commercially available from other sellers at brick & mortar locations throughout Hamilton County, the State of Indiana, and throughout the United States of America. No guarantees of non-duplication will be made to prospective vendors and exhibitors.
- **Direct Sales Companies:** Direct sale companies will be allowed but only a very small number will be admitted. Direct sale companies are defined as single-level marketing, in which a direct seller makes money by buying products from a parent organization and selling them directly to customers. Furthermore, direct sale companies can be defined as multi-level marketing, in which the direct seller may earn money from both direct sales to customers and by sponsoring new direct sellers and potentially earning a commission from their efforts. No guarantees of non-duplication will be made to prospective vendors and exhibitors.

Fee Amendment Statement:

It has been decided that a review of our fee structure will commence in 2019 by the Hamilton County Parks and Recreation Department. Any increases would be instituted to help fund increasing security, advertisement, promotion, entertainment, and staffing costs for this extremely popular Hamilton County event. At this time, the current fee will remain and any adjustments will be communicated to prospective vendors and exhibitors as soon as possible. ***This review will not have any impact on the 2019 festival rate.***
